SKETCHING SUPPLIES:

The following is a list of my favorite art supplies for sketching

- o Clipboard
- o Spiral bound sketch book
- o Sketching paper
- Colored Canson Mi-Tientes papers
- o Watercolor paper
- o Mechanical pencil with HB 0.5 lead
- o Prismacolor Verithin colored pencils
- o Staedtler non-photo blue pencil
- o Derwent water soluble pencil
- o Soft sketching pencil like Prismacolor Turquoise 2B
- Water-soluble pen such as Pilot Razor Point II or fine point Espresso pen
- Water-proof pen such as Pigma Microns or Faber-Castell Pitt Artists pen
- o White gel pen
- o Watercolor travel set such as Winsor & Newton
- o Pentel Aquash waterbrush
- o Small water container
- o Rag
- o A waterproof bag or case

Additional supplies to take into the field for may include a camera, binoculars, hand lens and field guides.
