## QUESTIONS TO EXPLORE YOUR PERSONAL ART AND STYLE

Pondering the questions below will help you look inward to explore your art-making process and the factors that influence your artistic identity and style. Once you've answered these questions, I recommend you complete a one-page summary in the form of an artist's statement. This activity will give you a deeper understanding of your work since it requires you to articulate the goals and context of your work in a clear and succinct manner.

- 1. Why do you make art? What benefits does the art-making process yield emotionally, physically, spiritually?
- 2. Who is the desired or intended audience for your work?
- 3. What actions or emotions do you hope your audience will take or feel when viewing your work?
- 4. How does your artwork reflect who you are: values, personality, interests, career, or life experiences?
- 5. How does your artwork reflect your identity: gender, nationality, ancestry, or ethnic background?
- 6. What is your favorite subject matter? What imagery and/or symbols frequently appear in your work?
- 7. Describe some themes, concepts, and ideas that you explore in your artwork.
- 8. Which media, materials, technologies, or processes do you employ in your work?
- 9. Do you work conceptually, abstractly, representationally, or use a blend of these approaches?
- 10. Describe your process of conceiving, designing, and creating artwork.
- 11. Would you describe your work as traditional, contemporary, or a blend?
- 12. Do you find inspiration in other forms of visual or performing arts such as music, dance, movies, architecture?
- 13. What style or art movement might you classify your work under?
- 14. What artists, genres, or historical art styles most influence your work?
- 15. When and where do your best artistic ideas come from? Are there specific times and places that inspire you?
- 16. When experiencing a bout of artist's block, in what ways do you overcome it and move back into creativity?
- 17. What role does chance, accident, and whimsy play in your artistic process; is it controlled or spontaneous?
- 18. What roles or responsibilities do you believe artists play and have in past, current, or future societies?
- 19. Do you consider your art unique and reflecting your own personal style? How could you make it more so?
- 20. How would you like to see your art and artistic process evolve in the future? Art skills, themes, subjects?
